## Case: Human disturbance of watebirds in protected areas


 Do water sport activities during the breeding season have negative effects on breeding Little Tern Sterna albifrons?





## SPA: Aalborg Bugt

- Classified in accordance with the EC Bird Directive (1979)
- Breeding Little Tern (Annex I)
- Managers must reject projects that will negatively affect protected birds









#### Challenges for managers

- Relevant questions:
  - How do Little Tern react to human disturbance?
  - How do different types of disturbance affect Little Tern?
  - How do different types interact with excisting levels of disturbance? (Cumulative effects)
  - How can the effects of different types of disturbance be mitigated?



## Solving the case

- Using a few review articles on human disturbance
- No external consultants where used
- Consulting local ornithologists as to the breeding habits in the area
- Conclusion: The arguments for rejecting the project where not strong enough



#### Terms for management

- Managers are often generalists, not experts!
- Managers often work under time stress
- Managers often work in a political system, where arguments must be strong to go against development and recreation!



# Promoting evidence based management

- Cooperation about experiments directed towards management issues, eg. human disturbance of waterbirds
- Collecting and processing existing and future knowledge into guidelines for management
- Establishing of professional networks between scientists and managers
