## EU Work Plan for Sport (2017-2020)

- Adopted on: 23 May 2017
- Inspired by the Commission's report (January 2017)
- Duration: 3 years and a half (until end December 2020)
- Shared responsibilities
- Less outputs
- Towards better cooperation with the sport movement
- Diversification of methods

# EU Work Plan for Sport (2017-2020)

## Priorities:

- Integrity of sport  
(good governance; safeguarding of minors, the specificity of sport, combatting corruption and match fixing, fighting doping)
- Economic dimension of sport  
(innovation in sport, and sport and the digital single market)
- Sport and society  
(social inclusion, coaches, education in and through sport, sport and health, environment and sport and media, sport diplomacy)

## Expert Groups:

- Integrity (including good governance)
- Skills and Human Resources development in sport

## EU Work Plan for Sport (2017-2020)

- **Other working methods:** cluster meetings, groups of interested Member States (peer learning activities), Presidency events, informal meetings of Sport Ministers and Directors, Commission studies and Commission conferences and seminars.
- Cooperation with **stakeholders** (including evaluation of the structured dialogue with the sport movement)

# Erasmus +

## 2017 selection

- Results published 24 July

- 410 applications (370 eligible)
- **160** selected projects (43% success rate):
  - 66 collaborative partnerships (36,5%)
  - 84 small collaborative partnerships (62%)
  - 10 Not-for-profit European Sport Events (19%)

# Erasmus +

## Erasmus+ 2018

- Publication of Erasmus+ **Call 2018** in October 2017
- **Sport InfoDay** – Brussels, 30 January 2018
- Sport budget: 46 ,5 million€
- Deadline for application **April 2018**
  - Collaborative partnerships (26.4 million€)
  - Small collaborative partnerships (6,5 million€)
  - Not-for-profit European sport events (4,5 million€)

# Erasmus +

## Erasmus+ 2018 *Collaborative partnerships Budget allocation*

- 25% to priorities 1 and 2 (projects supporting the participation in sport and physical activity)
- **25% to priorities 3 and 4 (projects supporting the education in and through sport, with special focus on skills development, as well as implementation of the EU Guidelines on Dual Careers of Athletes and projects supporting voluntary activity in sport)**
- 20% to priorities 5, 6 and 7 (projects supporting the integrity of sport such as anti-doping, fight against match-fixing and good governance in sport)
- 30% to the priorities 8 and 9 (projects aiming at combatting violence, racism, discrimination and intolerance in sport, projects aiming at encouraging social inclusion and equal opportunities in sport).

# Calls for proposals (Pilot Projects)

- 2 specific calls for proposals, based on the EP initiative
  - Sport as a tool for integration and social inclusion of **refugees**
  - Monitoring and coaching, through sports, of youngsters at risk of **radicalisation**
- Deadline 18 August; 139 applications (100 – refugees, 39 radicalisation – *preliminary data*)
- Evaluation process on-going
- Results - *November*



# #BeInclusive EU Sport Awards

- Aim: to highlight outstanding work and commitment in promoting social integration through sport across Europe
- The 3 best sport projects supporting social inclusion will be awarded (each project - €10,000)
- The application period is officially open from June 15 to September 15
- Awards ceremony: 22 November 2017 in Brussels
