

To and from Moesgård

Taxis

A taxi from centre of Aarhus to Moesgård will take around 15 mintues and costs app. 150 DKK during daytime.

Busses

Bus 18: Passes the Railway Station and ends at Moesgård Museum. It will take you app. 25 minutes to come to Moesgård from the Railway Station. There might be a delay of up till 15 minutes on this line during rush hours.

Friday morning: Bus 18 leaves from Park Alle/Banegårdspladsen(Park Alle/Railway Station) at 8.24 and arrives at Moesgård at 08.48.


Saturday morning: Bus 18 leaves from Park Alle/Banegårdspladsen at 8.12 and arrives at Moesgård at 8.34.

Bus 100 & 302: Takes you from the Railway Station to MoesgårdAllé in app. 20 minutes (ask the driver to stop at 'MoesgårdAllé'). From here, you need to cross the road and walk app. 1 km down MoesgårdAllé.
